A Housing Transitions Success Story:

One of our recent clients, Ann, was raised in State College. As an adult she relocated to a bigger city and built her own family there. She has two beautiful children, but recently, the father of her children suddenly passed away. Ann needed the support of her family, and made the tough decision to move back to State College. Ann and her children were able to live with family members for a short time, but they encountered tight accommodations and high tensions. She was in a tough situation because she did not really have close relationships back in the city and did not have any friends here in State College. Searching for help, Ann called 2-1-1, the number to call when experiencing a housing crisis, and was added to our wait list. The moment we had a Family Suite available, Ann was interviewed and approved to move into our Centre House Shelter.

Ann and her children called Centre House home for 89 days. During her stay, she made it 100% her home. She cooked wonderful meals for all of the residents and really brought a family atmosphere into our little house. Her children were often found playing hopscotch on our front sidewalks. They enjoyed craft nights, vision board making, and beauty nights in our great room.

With guidance from our case managers, Ann applied for a job in the school district. Everyone in our shelter, staff and residents, celebrated when Ann received her offer! Simultaneously, we all held our breath on the first day of school for the children - waiting to hear if they had a good first day. Hooray!! They arrived at Centre House jumping up and down with excitement at the end of the day. Smiling children are the best.

The next step in her journey was for Ann to be approved for an emergency housing voucher. With guidance from our staff, she made that happen as well, and the family was able to move into their own apartment. We miss this family, but are very proud of how we assisted them and what they have accomplished.

Ann's story is unique to her, but it is common for our residents to come here for similar reasons: they are working to raise families, and make a better life for themselves, but one tragedy, unplanned illness, or car repair can lead to a housing crisis. We are grateful to be their support system when that happens.


